The civil war that broke out in Yemen in 2014 is often viewed through the lens of the Saudi-Iranian geopolitical rivalry. Yet the documentation of illicit weapons conducted by GI-TOC field researchers in Somalia suggests the conflict may increasingly have security ramifications for the Horn of Africa.



In this webinar, taking place on Wednesday, 9 December at 16:00 CET, the author of GI-TOC's November 2021 report, "An Iranian Fingerprint?: Tracing Type 56-1 assault rifles in Somalia" will discuss the report's findings and their broader implications.
